<u>SHB 1114</u>	Food waste reduction	H Approps	Doglio	Neutral

Reducing the wasting of food in order to fight hunger and reduce environmental impacts. Establishes a goal for the state to reduce by fifty percent the amount of food waste generated annually by 2030, relative to 2015 levels. Requires the department of ecology, in consultation with the department of agriculture and the department of health, to develop and adopt a state wasted food reduction and food waste diversion plan designed to achieve the goal.

Child care assessment H H Svcs & Erly Reeves Neutral
[HB 1142](#) Requiring an assessment of Washington's child care industry. Requires the department of commerce to: (1) Enter into a contract for the development of a regional assessment of the child care industry to better understand issues affecting child care access and affordability for families; and (2) Conduct one or more competitive solicitations to select a third-party entity to conduct the industry assessment.

Expanded learning opp. prgs. H Education Kloba Neutral
[HB 1163](#)
 (SB 5188) Concerning expanded learning opportunity programs. Creates the expanded learning grant program to create demonstration projects within selected school districts of up to five years in length that support more time for instruction and opportunities for enrichment in order to combat summer learning loss and increase student achievement. Requires the office of the superintendent of public instruction to develop and administer the program. Authorizes the office of the superintendent of public instruction to award grants of up to one million five hundred dollars annually, through a competitive process, to school districts or state-tribal education compact schools if certain conditions are met. Makes an appropriation from the general fund to the office of the superintendent of public instruction for the purposes of this act, with a portion of the appropriation provided for staff to support the office of the superintendent of public instruction for the purposes of this act.

Traffic delays/electronics H Trans Young Neutral
[HB 1615](#) Establishing driving in significant traffic delays in certain circumstances as an exemption from the prohibition on using a personal electronic device while driving a motor vehicle.

Stopped vehicle/electronics H Trans Young Neutral
[HB 1616](#) Authorizing drivers to use personal electronic devices while a motor vehicle is temporarily stationary.

Expanded learning opp. prgs. S EL/K-12 Wilson Neutral

 (HB 1163) Concerning expanded learning opportunity programs. Creates the expanded learning grant program to create demonstration projects within selected school districts of up to five years in length that support more time for instruction and opportunities for enrichment in order to combat summer learning loss and increase student achievement. Requires the office of the superintendent of public instruction to develop and administer the program. Authorizes the office of the superintendent of public instruction to award grants of up to one million five hundred dollars annually, through a competitive process, to school districts or state-tribal education compact schools if certain conditions are met. Makes an appropriation from the general fund to the office of the superintendent of public instruction for the purposes of this act, with a portion of the appropriation provided for staff to support the office of the superintendent of public instruction for the purposes of this act.

Concussions in youth sports S EL/K-12 Carlyle Neutral
[SB 5238](#) Concerning concussions in youth sports. Requires the University of Washington medicine sports health and safety institute and the Harborview injury prevention and research center to collect and synthesize: (1) The most current scientific research, data, evidence-based best practices to improve concussion recognition, and to educate parents, teachers, coaches, and other supervising adults to intervene when a sports concussion is suspected; (2) The most current research and data on the

impact of concussions to female youth athletes and youth athletes participating in other than high-impact contact sports; and (3) Materials for licensed health care providers regarding concussion care. Requires the University of Washington medicine sports health and safety institute to: (1) Develop and maintain a web site to serve as a repository for the collected information; and (2) Work in conjunction with the Washington interscholastic activities association to promote the developed web site throughout the state. Requires the University of Washington to maintain a web site of up-to-date, concussion-related information and resources.
